Game Notes

RECAP...The Pride returned from New Jersey after having suffered a 2-0 loss during their mid-week competition against third place Sky Blue FC. Initially FC Gold Pride was able to hold off the dangerous attacks mounted by Sky Blue FC, but unfortunately found themselves down 2-0 after two early goals in the second half. Sky Blue FC midfielder, Rosana found the back of the net in the 46th minute of play. Forward, Natasha Kai quickly followed, scoring in the 61st minute. Though the Pride put together a few promising sequences they were unable to successfully counter. After their victory over the Pride, Sky Blue FC found themselves with 26 points and tied for third place with the Washington Freedom.

HEAD TO HEAD...The Pride (4-10-5) is 0-3 against Saint Louis (10-6-3) and will be looking for their first win against the second seeded team this weekend. With one game left, Saint Louis trails the first place Los Angeles Sol by five points and therefore will be unable to catch up even with a an end of the season victory.

MISSING... FC Gold Pride will once again see the absence of Brazilian center midfielder, Formiga who has been out nursing a knee injury for the past couple of weeks. The Pride will also miss the leadership of assistant coach and player, Sissi who will not attend Sunday's match due to prior commitments.

PLAYOFFS... Due to the fact that both teams have already secured their post season fate, the Pride will be out of contention for a playoff berth despite the outcome of Sunday's match. Saint Louis earned a guaranteed playoff berth earlier in the season, which will also remain unaffected.

ALL-STAR SELECTIONS... FC Gold Pride finds two of its players named to the 2009 WPS first ever all-star team. Brazilian center midfielder, Formiga was an automatic selection as one of the next-highest vote-getters to replace the five starters that will be absent due to the European Championships. WPS All-Star team Head Coach Abner Rogers and WPS Commissioner Tonya Antonucci named Canadian forward, Christine Sinclair as one of the seven at-large players that will complete the 18-player roster. The WPS All-Star team will face Swedish League Champions Umea IK at Anheuser Busch Stadium in Saint Louis, MO on August 30. Kickoff is scheduled for 5:30pm ET/4:30pm CT.

FAN APPRECIATION...This Sunday is Fan Appreciation Day so look for additional giveaways and opportunities to meet your favorite Pride players. Fans will be treated to special give aways. All 23 game day jerseys will be given away after Sunday's Match as part of Fan Appreciation Day.

UP NEXT... Though the 2009 Inaugural season is nearing a close for the Pride, four teams will continue on to the Playoffs and compete for a WPS Championship. The Los Angeles Sol and the Saint Louis Athletica are the only teams with guaranteed playoff berths so far.
